Who's Idea Was This Stupid Tax Bill -Sage Alexander



A tax bill has passed through the senate early in the morning of Saturday, December 2nd. It passed the House of Representatives last month, but due to revisions made since then, a final piece of legislation must be passed through both chambers of congress. The Congressional Budget Office estimated the bill would cost \$1.47 trillion in national debt over the next ten years. The tax cuts for both corporations and the wealthiest citizens greatly reduces the amount of money the government can spend. The administration's

actions earlier this year to raise the military budget by 700 billion dollars counteracts the claim by Donald Trump about limited government. The UN estimates it would cost 30 billion dollars to end world hunger for a year, and a bill proposed in April states the cost of free college is 47 billion a year.

The tax bills passed by the house of representatives and senate include differences, some written on the bill in pen. The house bill included a measure that will end tax deduction from student loan interest, both include huge corporate tax cuts, and each makes sweeping changes to health care which are expected to lead 13 million Americans to drop their insurance.

Wednesday, Congress members from both chambers met with the president to discuss the differences in the two bills passed by each part of congress. According to the New York Times; "The changes included a slightly higher corporate tax rate of 21 percent, rather than the 20 percent in the legislation that passed both chambers, and a lower top individual tax rate of 37 percent for the wealthiest Americans, who currently pay 39.6 percent. But the bill will still scale back some popular tax breaks, including the state and local tax deduction and the deductibility of mortgage interest." They reportedly removed a measure that would tax grad students on tuition waivers.

To understand the implications of severely cutting taxes on corporations, we must look at another United States president who campaigned for small government. In 1986, Ronald Reagan pushed tax cuts that brought corporate taxes to 35%, down from 48%. During his presidency, the national debt about tripled. Starting in 2019, our tax cut brings it down to 21%.

Other parts include the exemption of more families from estate tax (taxing inherited income), and the allowing of drilling in Alaska's Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. The claims of helping small businesses are solely based on the fact that this bill helps pass-through businesses. These are companies that are registered under a person rather than a separate corporation.

The economy is the strongest with a healthy middle class, and getting these Americans to pick up the slack from the wealthiest is sure to increase inequality and extend the imperialism of the United States.

There will be more from us later, little human, and you'd best believe it.

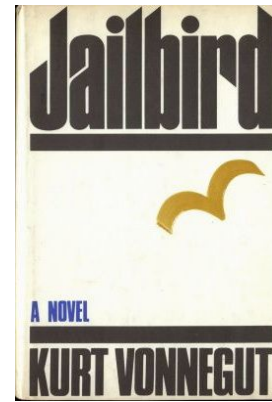
Truckee moves to replace Blue Bags with carts -Sage Alexander

On Nov 21st, the town of Truckee announced it would do away with a system that South Tahoe continues to use; wrapping yard trimmings and recycling in plastic bags. Instead, citizens will dispose of these waste items in trash bins. This comes at the expiration of the cities agreement with Tahoe Truckee Sierra Disposal, a privately owned business that removes the waste of the people of Truckee. Residents will be provided with the carts over the next three years.

South Tahoe Refuse is the only business that picks up the waste for South Tahoe's inhabitants. This business sorts through all trash generated in order to pick out recyclable materials, and boasts a 65% recycling rate. At the current moment, recycling is put into blue plastic bags and are picked up along with common waste. Green waste, or yard trimmings, need to be placed into a plastic garbage bag. An issue that arises is the waste of the bags themselves. South Tahoe Refuse uses one kind of garbage truck for residential pick ups, and therefore would have to redesign a way to separate each kind of trash apart from using wasteful plastic bags. This fall, STR issued a pilot program for green waste. Rather than plastic bags, inhabitants in certain neighborhoods were to use totes. This is a good way to deal with the amount of green waste in the time of raking pine needles without adding an extra step that increases the amount of trash generated. STR offers green waste as mulch for areas with poor soil.

South Tahoe City Council banned single use plastic bags December 7, 2015 from businesses (excluding restaurants). If the bag is 40% recycled, a business may still use them. South Tahoe Refuse's website does not mention if they have the equipment to recycle plastic grocery bags. If we can place regulations on shops to attempt to become 'greener', then we could also place these on the services the city chooses. I am ready for the government to move towards entirely compostable bags, or enforcing the ban they put into place by removing the 40% allowance.

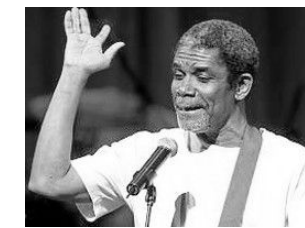
Remembering Musicians lost in 2017

died November 8th, 2017. He was the AC/DC rhythm guitarist and co-founder. He was 64.



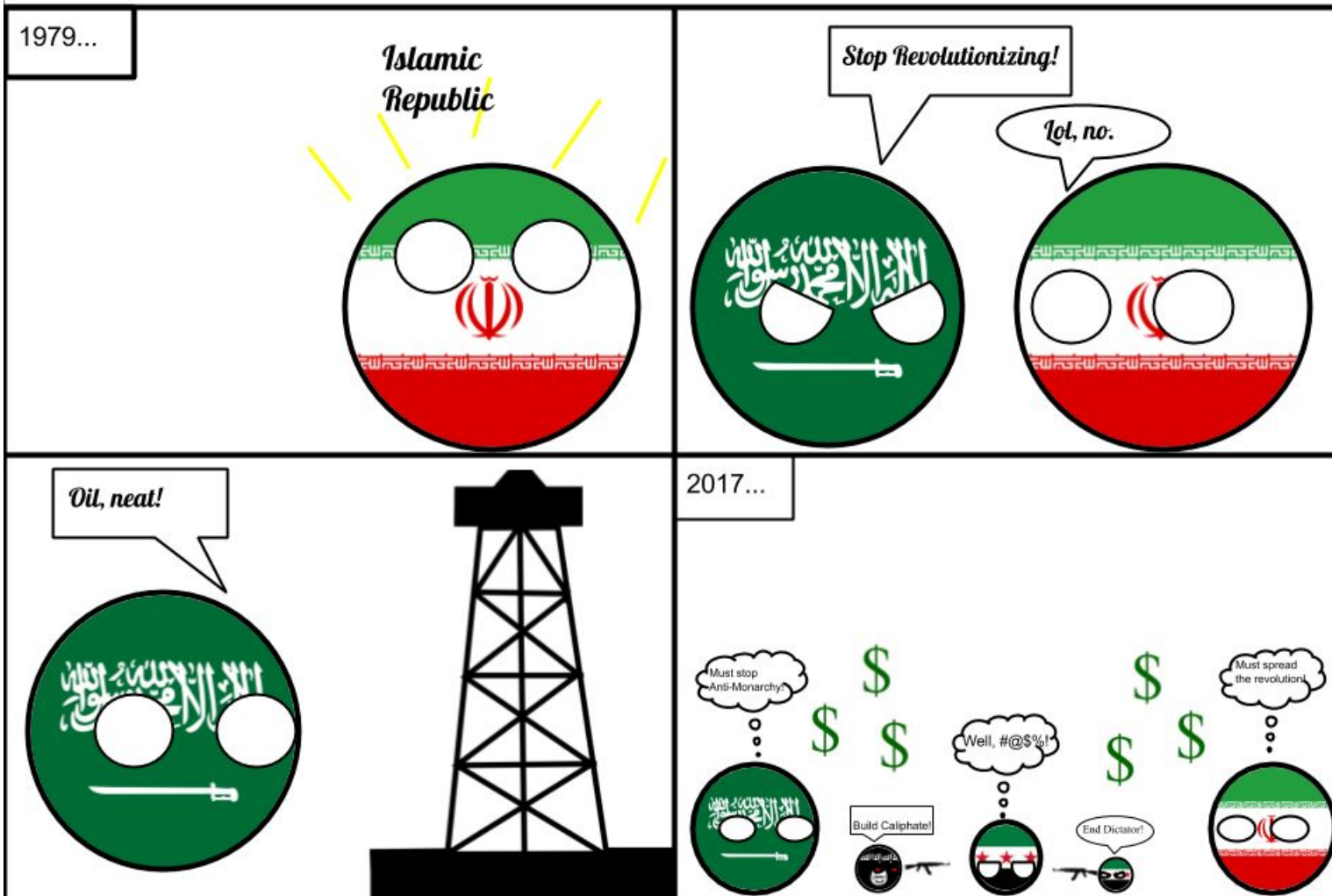
