CAPS, GOWNS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

STHS will be renting gowns for the 2017 ceremony that will be provided at **no cost** to graduates. By this time, your measurements for your cap and gown havebeen collected by the school. IF YOU HAVE NOT BEEN MEASURED, PLEASE SEE MS. TRUSCOTT IN THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE IMMEDIATELY.

Caps, gowns and tassels will be distributed at Graduation rehearsal. For best appearance, please place your gown on a hanger when you get home and if desired, press with a cool iron.

We request that you present yourself as formal and impressive as possible for the ceremony. Under your gown, gentlemen wear white shirts, long dark pants (no jeans), dark socks and dark shoes. Ladies will similarly wear business appropriate dresses, blouse and skirt or blouse and pants, and low heeled shoes (high heels do not work well on the football field).

The Mortarboard (graduation cap) is a universal symbol of academic achievement that is to be worn so that the top is level with one point straight forward and the tassel hanging to the right side of the point. It shows respect for the ceremony, your peers, STHS, your other schools, your parents and the community when your Mortarboard is clean. At the end of the ceremony, your class president will guide you all in "turning your tassels" at which time you will move them from right to left in unison signifying the completion of your high school career.

After the ceremony, you will go up to the Student Union to collect your official diploma and return your gown. You are able to keep your mortarboard and tassel.

t is imperative that every graduating Senior, who is to take part in the graduation exercises, be present for rehearsal. Rehearsal will be Thursday, June 8th promptly after school from 2:45 until approximately 4:00 p.m. ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY. You are required to remain for the full rehearsal and all instructions. All graduation speakers or performers should plan to remain after rehearsal on Thursday, June 8th, to practice giving your speech.

Weather permitting, the Graduation Ceremony will be held outdoors on Viking Field with unlimited admission. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be moved into the Blue Gym and each Senior will be allowed three (3) guests (tickets will be distributed on June 8th after practice). Admission to the gym will be by ticket only.

On **Friday**, **June 9th**, Seniors must assemble at the Viking Lodge promptly at 3:00 p.m., with cap and gown in hand. Graduates will be checked to ensure no inappropriate items are available to spoil the dignity of the Graduation Ceremony.

Parents/friends are requested not to leave their seats to take pictures during the ceremony. The cooperation of all will insure the proper formal setting for the commencement. Photography will be available to individual graduates. Immediately following the ceremony, a short reception for parents, relatives and friends will be held in the Student Union.

Please note that the actual diploma will not be distributed at the ceremony. Seniors who are **properly cleared of any outstanding debts** will receive their diplomas at a designated area in the Student Union during the reception. **Diplomas will not be distributed until accounts have been cleared**.

Many colleges require shots, including Hepatitis B and MMR (measles, mumps and rubella). It is time to take charge of your health—talk to your doctor about getting these vaccines today!

- ⇒ Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough)-1 dose
- → Meningococcal—2 vaccines types ACWY-1 dose after 16 years type B—at least 2 doses
- ➡ Flu—1 dose every year
- ➡ Human Papillomavirus (HPV)—2-3 doses, depending on when you get your first dose
