## South Tahoe High School Counseling Department Letter of Recommendation Process

Dear Parents and Students

Seniors who will be applying to private universities may be asked to provide one to three letters of recommendation as a part of the college application requirement. University of California and/or California State University applications for admission do not have this same requirement. In order to help facilitate the large number of letter of recommendations that the counselors receive and to increase their effectiveness, we have designed a letter of recommendation packet to assist us in the process.

#### **Profile Packet Instructions**

All students who intend to apply to colleges and universities that request a counselor's recommendation letter must complete this packet of information. You must complete and submit the entire student profile packet at least two weeks prior to your admission application deadline. Due to the amount of students requesting letters and the time available to each counselor during the application season we need a better process to compile all of the information about each student in a timely manner.

The recommendation letter is a confidential communication between the high school counselor and the college admissions office. Counselors are not obligated to share the contents of a recommendation letter with either the student or their parents.

### THE LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION PROCESS

These steps are the responsibility of the students and parents. Counselors are ready and willing to assist in the process.

o Obtain College Applications

Most applications are available online. Students fill out the following information in the Secondary School Counselor Report:

o Have either an ACT or SAT score on file

If you have not yet taken the SAT/ACT college entrance exams, you need to register for the earliest available due date. Most colleges require one of these scores as part of their admission evaluation. In addition, the NCAA require test score information to determine athletic eligibility for participation in NCAA Division I and Division II participation. Students need to complete the Free and Reduced Lunch paperwork to receive a fee waiver for the ACT and/or SAT tests. Eligible students can request fee waivers at the counseling office.

Be certain your "Profile Packet" is complete and submitted to your counselor on time!
 Remember that the information you provide helps your counselor compose a letter of recommendation that is personally tailored to your unique character, qualities and abilities.

- Request teacher recommendations for many colleges
   Find out the requirements for each college that you will be applying for admission
  - Make a copy of the student profile for the teachers that you need to write recommendations
  - Make your request personally. Talk to the teacher at least 3 weeks prior to the deadline date.
  - Follow up with a thank-you note after the letter is written.
- o Some colleges require mid-year reports.
- Scholarship applications usually require recommendations and official transcripts.
   Students may want to use the same letters of recommendation for each scholarship application.
   Students must give at least two weeks to a school official if they need a recommendation.
   Students must give the registrar two days processing time to complete official transcripts.
