## INSTRUCTIONS:

- 250 credits and passing High School Math I and Senior Project are required to graduate. A student should have at least 120 credits and the ninth and tenth grade course requirements completed prior to August 2019. If not, you must repeat the class that you failed.
- Juniors must enroll in a minimum of six (6) classes (3 each term) and up to eight (8) classes. You must be on track to graduate, have a 2.0 or higher gpa, have parent permission and must not have an attendance contract to have Late In or Early Out.
- The required courses for juniors are English, US History, and math. You will be placed in those classes based on test scores and teacher recommendation. (p) Indicates college prep.
- From the course offering form, select three (3) or up to five (5) elective courses. Choose at least 3 alternates to be used for scheduling conflicts.
