## INSTRUCTIONS:

- 250 credits and passing High School Math I and Senior Project are required to graduate. A student should have at least 180 credits and the ninth, tenth, and eleventh grade course requirements completed prior to August 2019. If not, you must repeat the class that you failed.
- Seniors must enroll in a minimum of six (6) classes (3 each term) and up to eight (8) classes. You must be on track to graduate, have a 2.0 or higher gpa, have parent permission and must not have an attendance contract to have Late In or Early Out.
- The required courses for seniors are English and Economics/Civics. You will be placed in those classes based on test scores and teacher recommendation. You may choose AP Government/Politics in place of Civics.
- From the course offering sheet, select four (4) or up to six (6) elective courses. Select at least 3 alternate courses. Alternates are used for scheduling conflicts. (p) Indicates college prep.
